

KLI Partnered Internship Program



The Kravis Leadership Institute has partnered with BRAC to offer a summer internship for CMC students.

BRAC, the largest non-profit in the developing world, was launched in Bangladesh in 1972 and today reaches more than 138 million people with its holistic approach to addressing poverty by providing micro-loans, self-employment opportunities, health services, education, legal and human rights education and livelihood training.

Location: Bangladesh

Duration: June to August

Duties or Scope of Work: Selected interns will be placed in one of the two possible internships:

- 1.) Internship with Challenging the Frontiers of Poverty Reduction – Targeting the Ultra poor (CFPR- TUP) programme:
 - Visiting projects, interviewing participants and developing communication materials, brochure, case stories etc.
 - Proposal writing and content development, editorial support.
 - Work with the team in organizing events.
- 2.) Internship with Social Enterprises
 - Visit BRAC investments to learn about the social aspects and status/achievements
 - Visit BRAC enterprises to learn about the social aspects and develop materials for Brochure, Website and other communications deliverables.

Intern qualifications:

- CMC sophomore or junior
- Applicants must have a minimum GPA of 8.5 and be in good standing with the college, as verified by the Dean of Students Office.
- Strong interest in international development
- Excellent communication skills in writing and presentation.

Preferences:

- The KLI partnered internship program is open to CMC students with preference given to students enrolled in the Leadership Sequence and/or affiliated with KLI (e.g., KLI

assistant, SOURCE, Sophomore Leadership Experience participants, KLI workshop participants , etc.)

Academic Requirement: This internship requires enrollment and completion of the INT 199: Summer Internship in Leadership with Dr. Sherylle Tan in conjunction with the internship. This course earns one-half academic credit. Recipients who fail to complete the internship and required coursework may be required to return all or part of their award.

Stipend: Travel awards of up to \$4,500.

In addition to the online application form, the information listed below should be submitted to **Career Services Center** by **Friday, February 17, 2012 at noon**. Short-listed candidates will be contacted for an interview by the partner organization.

- Resume or CV
- Personal Statement – Please answer the following questions as a part of your personal statement.
 1. Why do you want to do an internship with this organization?
 2. Why your qualifications make you the best candidate for this internship? What value can you add to the organization as an intern?
 3. What are your expectations from this internship?
 4. How will this internship further your development and relate to your major career goals?
- One Recommendation – Please send your recommender the link (<http://tinyurl.com/KLIRecommendationForm>) to the Online Recommendation Form
- A detailed budget with an explanation of how it was developed. Budget should include: Round Trip Airfare; Housing; Food; Local Transportation; Supplemental International Medical Insurance (which includes coverage for emergency medical evacuation); ISIC student card fee (www.counciltravel.com); Immunizations; and Incidentals.
