# Claremont McKenna College

Alumni Survey Results

This report combines two surveys of CMC alumni post-graduation activities and opinions, with enrollment reports from the National Student Clearinghouse. Topics covered include: alumni activities, career and post-graduate education data, and evaluations of CMC.

- American Council on Education (ACE) Young Alumni Survey- Claremont McKenna College participated in the ACE Young Alumni Survey during the fall of 2010, along with 20 other institutions including large research universities, 4-year private schools, and 2-year public institutions. The survey was conducted through phone interviews with 400 CMC alumni of ages 25-39.
- Higher Education Data Sharing consortium (HEDS) Alumni Survey- Claremont McKenna College participated in the HEDS Alumni Survey during the spring of 2014, along 32 other comparison institutions. Alumni from 1-year, 5-years, and 10-years post-graduation were asked to participate in a web-based survey by email. The overall response rate for CMC was 22.1% (n= 163).
- National Student Clearinghouse (NSC)- The Office of Institutional Research collected and analyzed degree information for alumni who received undergraduate degrees from Claremont McKenna College between 1994 and 2014 (n=5,797), through the National Student Clearinghouse's StudentTracker service. Degree reporting for NSC members is optional and has some limitations: There are large inconsistencies across institutions and sometimes even within one institution with multiples schools (law, medical, etc.), in reporting degree information to the NSC. This includes whether or not a degree was received and potentially blank fields for degree titles and majors. Additionally, student records may be intentionally blocked by a student or an institution.



# **Graduate or Professional School:**

Of the 5,797 individuals who received bachelor's degrees from CMC between 1994 and 2014, 33.4% (n=1,936) have records of graduate degrees with the Clearinghouse. There were 21 alumni with unknown degrees; since we are unable to confirm whether those are graduate-level (many alumni pursue additional bachelor's degrees, certificates, and other post-bac programs), those "unknown" records are not counted in this percentage or in the table for degree types provided below.

Additionally, 265 alumni have received multiple graduate degrees, such as an MA and PhD, or an MA and an MBA. Those individuals are only counted once in the 33.4% above, but all of their degrees are reflected in the degree type table below and in the listing of degrees by institution that follows.




Undergraduate experiences contribution to personal development:




To what extent did your experience with internships as an undergraduate contribute to your learning and personal development?

To what extent did your experience working with faculty on research as an undergraduate contribute to your learning and personal development?







To what extent did your experience with study abroad as an undergraduate contribute to your learning and personal development?

To what extent did your experience with on-campus employment as an undergraduate contribute to your learning and personal development?






Upon graduation, were you effectively prepared with the knowledge and skills you needed?



# Do you think that YOUR college or university charged you a fair price for your college education?




Given the time dedicated to your degree and the money spent on tuition, all in all do you believe your college education was worth it?




### How connected do you feel to your undergraduate institution?
