To Constitute the American Republic: Statesmanship and Other Maladies

Elkin will present an account of how to constitute the commercial republic which Americans aspire to realize. He will build on Madison's theory but go beyond it guided by Machiavelli. The result, among other things, will be a description of republican statesmanship.

Stephen Elkin is professor emeritus of Government at the University of Maryland, the author of *Reconstructing the Commercial Republic: Constitutional Design After Madison* and numerous other books and articles. He is the founding editor of the journal *The Good Society*.
