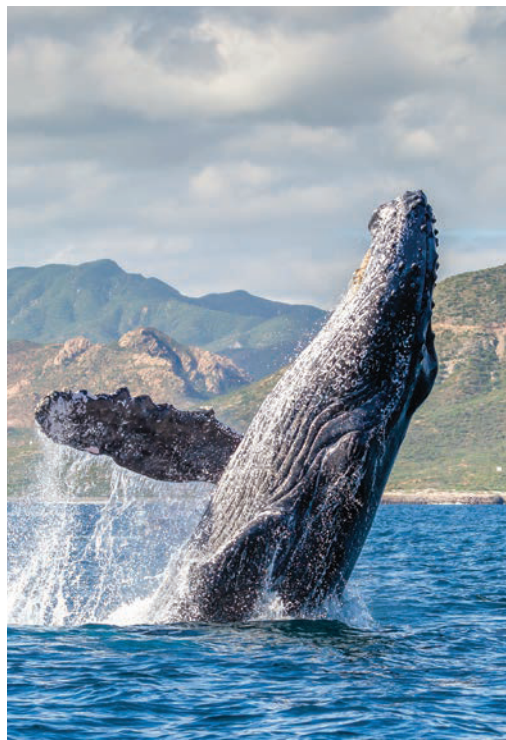
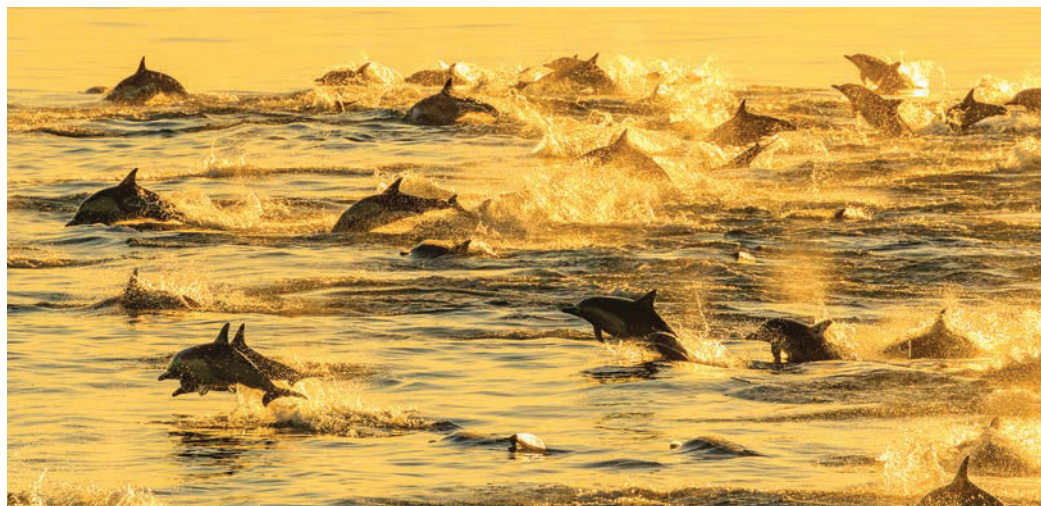




Baja California: Among the Great Whales

In conjunction with National Geographic-Lindblad Expeditions, a small band of intrepid Claremont travelers will journey from March 13 to 20, 2027 through the Gulf of California aboard the *National Geographic Venture*. Our itinerary includes hikes, Zodiac cruises, and snorkeling, along with delightful cuisine and hearty CMC camaraderie. A highlight, of course, will be the search for dolphins, sea lions, and up to six species of whales.

Families are welcome: thanks to a special National Geographic Explorers-in-Training family program, children and teens will learn about this wild corner of the world—from tiny hummingbirds to massive humpback whales.

As a biological scientist, I have spent my career teaching students and studying whales and their prehistoric ancestors. The Gulf of California is the perfect laboratory to continue these studies and share them with you. Seeing whales, sea lions, dolphins, sea birds, and other wildlife in their natural habitat while learning about the beauty of Baja California will be the opportunity of a lifetime.

Expedition Highlights

Explore Baja California's pristine coastlines and living sea in search of dolphins, sea lions and as many as five different varieties of whales. Board local pangas and enter sheltered lagoons for up-close encounters with California gray whale mothers and their newborn calves. Witness an undersea wonderland, serene desert isles and the most beautiful sunsets on Earth. Hike through towering cacti and up striking desert canyons or take a slow photo stroll along the shore. Every day is different and rewarding, with opportunities to indulge in active or relaxing pursuits.

- ✓ Enter gray whale birthing lagoons for up-close encounters with gray whale mother-calf pairs.
- ✓ Embark on regular marine safaris in search of dolphins, sea lions and up to five species of whales.
- ✓ Snorkel amidst the vibrant sea life, including curious sea lions at Los Islotes.
- ✓ Hike desert isles, including Espíritu Santo Archipelago National Park, and witness the variety of flora and fauna thriving in this region.
- ✓ Spot myriad bird species including diving pelicans, magnificent frigatebirds and brown and blue-footed boobies.
- ✓ With National Geographic Explorers-in-Training, our exclusive family program, kids and teens will learn about this vibrant part of the world—from migrating gray whales to desert plant species.

Itinerary

MARCH 13

LORETO, MEXICO/EMBARK

Arrive in Loreto in early afternoon and transfer to *National Geographic Venture* to set sail at sunset. (D)

Opt for a one-night pre-voyage extension in Loreto to relax and explore this picturesque gulfside town dotted with Spanish colonial architecture.

MARCH 14

BAHÍA CONCEPCIÓN

Awake in Bahía Concepción, and take your coffee to the deck to witness the colorful landscapes revealed by the first of many gorgeous sunrises. This biodiversity hotspot is ripe for exploration. Board Zodiacs in search of whales and other marine life, kayak through lush mangrove systems and snorkel in turquoise waters. On land, join an invigorating hike among towering cacti, or stroll the pristine beaches and learn about the ecology from the naturalists. (B,L,D)



MARCH 15

EXPLORING THE GULF OF CALIFORNIA

The Gulf of California is home to great biological diversity, and with some luck, sightings of whales, dolphins and other sea life are among the highlights of your journey. The plan is flexible as guests explore some of the uninhabited islands sprinkled across these waters. Conditions permitting, you may hike, kayak or paddleboard. Learn about this ecosystem from a naturalist and capture amazing photos with help from your certified photo instructor. (B,L,D)

MARCH 16

BOCA DE SOLEDAD

After breakfast, transfer by motorcoach from Puerto Escondido to Puerto López Mateos. Settle in for unforgettable experiences in this tranquil lagoon. Together with savvy local fisherman, you'll venture out in pangas to view the numerous mother-calf pairs. With luck, enjoy up-close interactions with these curious creatures. Enjoy lunch at a traditional restaurant before returning to the ship in late afternoon. (B,L,D)

MARCH 17-19

CABO PULMO/LOS ISLOTES/GULF OF CALIFORNIA

Venture south to discover the gems of the southern Gulf. These islands and surrounding waters are celebrated for their conservation stories, marine life and the many thrilling experiences on offer. Some of the locations you may visit or enjoy by Zodiac include:



CABO PULMO NATIONAL MARINE PARK

Set out to snorkel the pristine reefs of Cabo Pulmo National Marine Park, one of the most successful national marine parks in the world. Chat with locals about their advocacy to protect this unique place, including a cessation of fishing to protect the reef.

ISLA ESPÍRITU SANTO

A national park as well as UNESCO World Heritage site with volcanic rock formations, scenic beaches and coral reefs. This magical island offers excellent hiking opportunities and crystal-clear waters for snorkeling. It's a popular destination for researchers monitoring sea turtles.

LOS ISLOTES

Located at the northern tip of the UNESCO Biosphere Reserve, Los Islotes is largely inaccessible to people and home to a large colony of sea lions. Conditions permitting, the ship will anchor off the rocky island where you don flippers, a mask, and snorkel (provided) and swim with these curious inhabitants.

ISLA SAN JOSÉ

One of the larger islands in the Gulf of California, San José offers several landing possibilities depending on conditions and the whim of the moment. Photograph the ochre cliffs of the island's eastern shore, hike an enchanted, cactus-laden arroyo or visit the abandoned salt works to the west. Discover rare wildlife among desert islands. (B,L,D)

MARCH 20

DAY 8: LORETO/DISEMBARK

After breakfast, disembark the ship and transfer to the Loreto airport for flights home. (B)

LORETO PRE-VOYAGE EXTENSION

Arrive early for a relaxing and educational pre-voyage stay in the charming, seaside town of Loreto, Mexico, the first colonial settlement in Baja California. Visit the Jesuit-founded Misión San Francisco Javier de Viggé-Biaundó and learn about the rich history of the mission and the surrounding area. Enjoy time to explore Loreto on your own and experience the culture and cuisine of this tranquil town.

CAPACITY: 50 cabins accommodating 100 guests.

REGISTRY: United States. **OVERALL LENGTH:** 238 feet.

PUBLIC AREAS: Global gallery; fitness center; LEXspa; lounge with full service bar and facilities for films and presentations; observation deck; mudroom with lockers for expedition gear, and a partially covered sundeck with chairs and tables. The open Bridge provides guests an opportunity to meet the officers and captain and learn about navigation.

MEALS: Served in single seatings with unassigned tables for an informal atmosphere. Cuisine is fresh, sustainable, accented with regional flair and served plated.

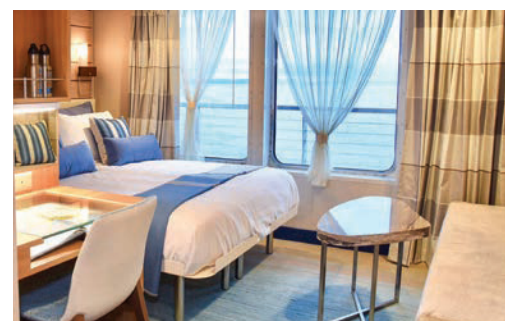
CABINS: All cabins face outside with windows or portholes, private facilities and climate controls. Category 4 cabins have step-out balconies.

EXPEDITION EQUIPMENT: A fleet of 8 Zodiacs and 24 kayaks, stand-up paddleboards, ROV (remotely operated vehicle); hydrophone, splash-cam, underwater video camera and video microscope.

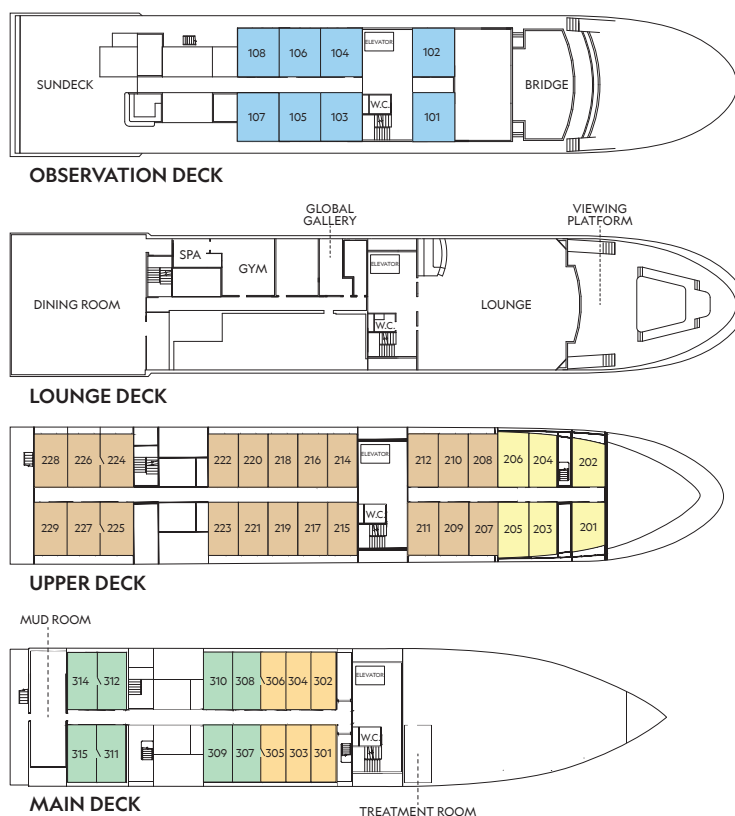
SPECIAL FEATURES: Guest Wi-Fi access, elevator, National Geographic certified photo instructor, undersea specialist and a medical professional.

WELLNESS: The vessel is staffed by a wellness specialist and features a gym with an elliptical machine, treadmill, exercycles, hand weights and resistance bands. Massages in the LEXspa are available by appointment.

Cabins feature two single beds that can convert to a queen, a writing desk and two portholes.

CATEGORY 2

Main Deck #307-315
Cabins feature two single beds that can convert to a queen, a writing desk and two portholes.

CATEGORY 3

Upper Deck #201-206
Cabins feature two single beds that can convert to a queen, a writing desk and two large view windows.

CATEGORY 4

Upper Deck #207-229
Cabins feature two single beds that can convert to a queen, a writing desk, sliding glass door and small, private balcony.

CATEGORY 5

Observation Deck #101-108
Cabins feature two single beds that can convert to a queen, large view windows, an expanded bathroom, writing desk, ample storage space and a convertible sofa bed to accommodate a third person.

NOTE: Solo Occupancy cabins are available in Categories 1 and 2 only. Third person rates are available in Category 5 cabins at one half the double occupancy rate.

PRICING: Prices quoted in this flyer are per person based on double occupancy in USD. Prices shown are subject to change and availability at time of booking. However, our expedition pricing is determined far in advance of initial departure on the basis of then-existing projections of fuel and other costs. In the event of increases in those costs, including but not limited to increases in the price of fuel, currency fluctuations, increases in government taxes or levies or increased security costs, we reserve the right to adjust the price of your expedition or add a surcharge to cover such unexpected increases. We will always provide an explanation of the reason for increase in costs.

COST INCLUDES: Accommodations aboard ship; all meals as indicated in the itinerary, beer, wine, cocktails and spirits with premium wines and liquors available for purchase; all shore excursions, sightseeing, special access permits and entrance fees; transfers to/from airport if traveling within recommended arrival and departure windows; morning stretch classes and access to the fitness center; access to the OM System Photo Gear Locker; 24-hour access to the lounge, observation decks, library and other shared spaces; complimentary reusable water bottle; gratuities to local guides; basic Wi-Fi with the option to upgrade; services of Lindblad Expeditions' natural history staff, National Geographic certified photo instructor, medical professional and local guides; port taxes and service charges.
